Climbing Works Bouldering Competition

• On Tuesday 24th January a group of eighteen pupils (made up of year 5 and 6 pupils) from HBJ took part in the School Boul-• dering Qualification round at the Mini Works (within the Climbing Works). We took a mini-bus to the Climbing Works, arriv-• ing just before 1:00pm allowing us to get ready. We had a wide variety of climbers (including some very experienced and some

with minimal climbing experience) compete, but every one of us tried our hardest and did incredibly well.

• The climbing club set up by Mr. Adebola was a big help to a lot of climbers who were able to hone their skills from November • to February in a familiar setting.

•There were twelve different challenges to try and each pupil was allowed three attempts to master the climb. Each school has •2 hours to try the qualification blocs (8-12 climbs on "wasps") with points being scored on how many of the climbs get topped •(10 points for completing it first time) and the number of attempts. There was also a bonus hold that gave 3 points. As the •number of the climb increased, the challenges got harder and included things like over-hangs and monkey bars style moves that •needed to be executed. The top 6 scores from our school will be added up to give HBJ an overall score which will the be com-•pared to other schools. The qualification rounds finish on the 11th February and results and finalists will be announced once all •of the qualification rounds have been completed.

•The top 10 Sheffield Primary and Secondary schools will be invited to take part in the Sheffield final on 30th March 2023. Hopefully from our performance on the day we will be competing in the finals and we will look forward to it if we are.

The Childcare Choices campaign aims to raise awareness and understanding of the support available from the government with the costs of childcare.

You could be entitled to:

up to £2,000 a year of Tax-Free Childcare per child (or £4,000 if disabled) for children up to 11, or 17 if they're disabled. You can also get help with up to 85% of your childcare costs for children up to 16 with Universal Credit or 30 hours of free childcare for 3 and 4 year olds if you're a working family in England.

Sheffield Diving

On Tuesday 21st February Georgia Davenport (Ex GB diver) came into school to deliver an England Diving Talent Programme 'Little Rippers 'Talent Search' at school.

Members of the Sheffield Diving elite coaching team have delivered a fun physical education lesson, based around fundamental diving movements. Over 2000 pupils from Primary Schools across the City took part in the sessions throughout February 2023. The sessions seek to identify pupils with the potential to reach a high standard in the Olympic sport of springboard and platform diving.

This session was only done with our three Y3 classes and 25% (22 out of our 85 pupils present) were chosen to advance to stage 2. This is a fantastic achievement considering the thousands of athletically talented pupils tested to date. Their results indicate that they are in the top 10% for various characteristics that elite level athletes possess (strength, flexibility, power, speed and coordination).



HBJ Sports Council

Sports Councillors hold a very important role within school sports at HBJ. As well as giving their insights into sport/PE lessons they are also a focal point for pupils within their class to share their sporting information and ideas (to then share with Mr. Adebola). After a PE lesson they give the teacher (or staff member) 30 seconds of feedback to explain understanding of the learning question and if they thought it was achieved as well as letting staff know what they enjoyed and anything they felt can be improved.

In our next meeting (next half term) Mr Adebola plans to speak to the councillors about up and coming changes that we want to make to our school playgrounds.
