The impact of the additional funding can be seen in the increased participation by pupils, the increased confidence of staff members in teaching physical education and the wider opportunities available to all pupils. The data shows a 6% increase in engagement of pupils in extracurricular opportunities and an additional 14 hours of level 2 competition opportunities. Sports Leadership opportunities have increased significantly since 2015-16 by 37%.

The wider impact is that, HBJS are very fortunate to have a dynamic and enthusiastic subject leader who has created a culture of health and well-being regardless of level or ability. The sheer breadth of opportunities ensures that all pupils are able to engage with sport and physical activity at some level of participation.

The third annual Sports Presentation Evening saw record numbers of pupils and parents in attendance to share and celebrate the sporting achievements throughout this academic year.
