- 4. They particularly liked to raid monasteries, and in 793AD they raided the monastery at Lindisfarne in Northumbria.
- 5. The monasteries were not very well protected and contained valuable goods like gold and jewels, imported foods and other useful materials.
- 6. The Vikings also stole manuscripts and bibles. These were sold back to the religious leaders who could not bear to see them lost or damaged.
- 7. The Vikings went on to invade Scotland and in time they began to settle and stay there.
- 8. In 866AD they raised an army and captured the city of York.
