The people of the Stone Age used stone tools to hunt.

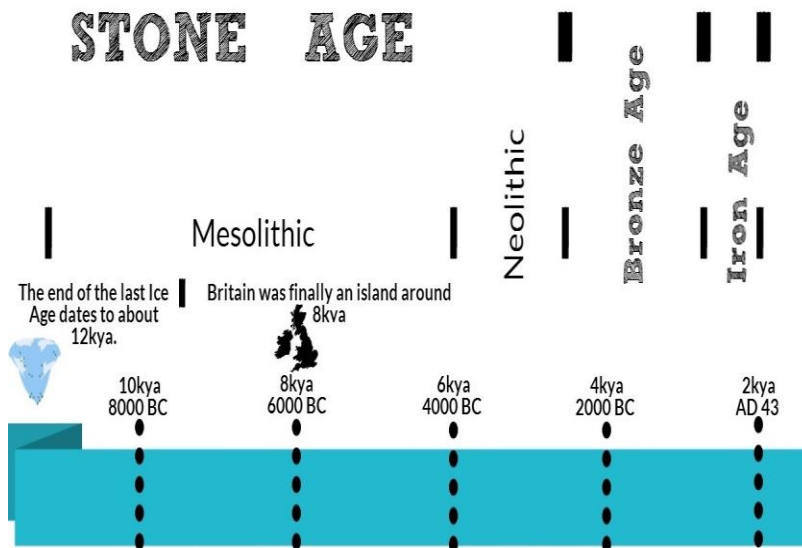
Once people were able to use tin and copper to make bronze they could make stronger tools and weapons.

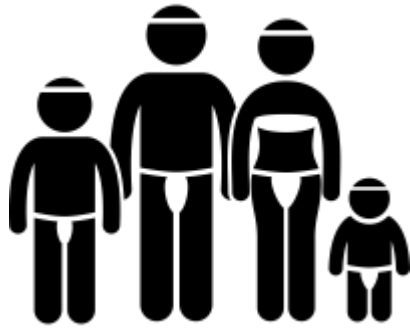
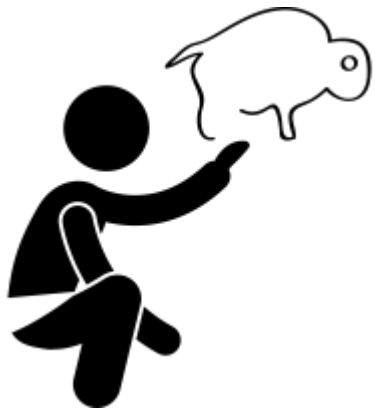

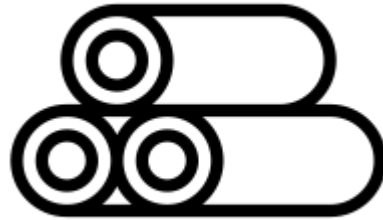
