The English Institute of Sport was the venue for the South Yorkshire School Games, a competition which recognises the best schools across Rotherham, Barnsley, Doncaster and Sheffield. Having qualified in both the Gymnastics and Cheerleading City finals, HBJ had two teams representing Sheffield.

The event is similar in format to the Olympic Games, with a range of sports Team HBJ kicked off with the Gymnastics competition first. Lola, Freya, Ciara, Ruth and Akbar had finished second in the City finals and sporting their new costumes, looked the business!

The team had to complete their floor routine followed by their vault. Having put in the hours of practice, all five of the team produced their best displays in a fiercely contested competition. The judges scored the performances and we had to wait nervously until all the teams had finished. The results were announced and Team HBJ finished a credible 6th in South Yorkshire.
