

## Music for Home Learners!

### The Warm Up

1. Rubber Chicken - a silly one to get your heart pumping!
2. Alignment - feet, knees, shoulders, arms. Standing like a singer.

### A new word for today - **PULSE**

What does it mean? The pulse is the heartbeat of the music, it keeps going steadily throughout everything we do.

#### **Che che kule song (call and response);**

Nb. These lyrics are a phonetic representation and should be used as a guide only.

Start to learn notation symbols with french counting

Ta = Crotchet

Tee-tee = Quavers

Rest = Crotchet rest

#### **"Rhythm rhythm on the wall, can I clap the rhythm to you all"**

This section will have you reading short rhythm patterns - if you aren't sure if you got them right, you can rewind and do it again!

See if you can write some rhythms yourself - be as inventive as you like. You could even get a percussion instrument (drum/shaker/bells/chopsticks or make some yourself) to replace clapping.

Next you are going to learn a 3 part match song - match songs are pieces of music that are different, but can be sung at the same time.
