

Ways to help out at home

Reading – Read at home as much as possible, with, and to, your child. EVERY DAY! Reading is always the one thing that will make the biggest difference to your child's education.

Writing – Research and write an information text about an animal of your own choosing and the environment it is perfectly adapted to live in. We are writing about penguins and camels – which animal could you choose?

Team time talk (Oracy) – What happened in 'Holes' when you read it today? Which lessons did you do this afternoon? What key knowledge can you tell me from them? Can you set me a maths question from your learning this morning to see if I can solve it? You might be better than me!

Maths – Use the SATs study guide from parents' evening, and the Whiterose workbooks that have been sent home at the end of each unit to retrieve and practice learning from the year so far. Correcting mistakes and tackling incomplete questions in your old workbooks would be a great start.

PSHE – Discuss important topics around online safety, such as giving away personal information, being careful what links you follow and the site you visit, and the pros and cons of social media.

Science – Explore the incredible evolutionary pathway of life one Earth by visiting and exploring this <u>online tree of life</u>. onezoom.org

Next half term, your child will start to receive some online homework – this will focus largely on Maths and SPAG. The final details of this are being organised right now, but in January there will be weekly homework set that should help your child work towards plugging any gaps that still remain as we move closer to SATs, and to your child's transition to secondary school.
