## Ways to help out at home

**Reading** – We will be enjoying reading a poetry collection out loud in school, which is excellent for developing children's oracy skills. We encourage you to do the same - any collection by Michael Rosen is usually a hit!

**Writing** – Practice your formal letter writing skills by writing a letter to your local MP about an issue you feel strongly about! Our local MP Paul Blomfield is a friend of the school and always happy to hear from his constituents. paul.blomfield.mp@parliament.uk

**Tea time talk (Oracy)** –Which lessons did you do this afternoon? What key knowledge can you tell me from them? What have you found out as part of your local history project? Can you set me a maths question from your learning this morning to see if I can solve it? You might be better than me!

**Maths** – Use the SATs study guide from parents' evening, and the Whiterose workbooks that have been sent home at the end of each unit to retrieve and practice learning from the year so far. Correcting mistakes and tackling incomplete questions in your old workbooks would be a great start.

**Art** – Encourage your child to share and practise the skills that they have been learning to produce artwork of their own direction at home. We'll be focusing on cityscapes and the impressionist style, but we encourage children to branch out and create something that inspires them. We'd love to see any paintings or other artwork that children produce!
