Oh, Jean Genie lives on his back
The Jean Genie loves chimney stacks
He's outrageous, he screams and he bawls (Jean Genie)
Jean Genie, let yourself go, whoah

Where have you heard the name *Monroe* before?
Who is Snow White?

You may ask, how does Bowie come up with these strange lyrics? Well, he used a technique called *cut-ups*.

David Bowie, Kurt Cobain, Thom Yorke, Bob Dylan, and Iggy Pop have all used the same 'cut up' technique to write many of their songs. Using poems or lyrics they'd already written, they cut the words apart, mixed them around, and put them back together in a different order to achieve a more poetic and mysterious sound.
