Two of our runners were celebrated for top 10 finishes. Lily.C-Y4 & Evan.S-Y5 placed 9th & 10th respectively and were at the presentation ceremony to be handed their certificates.

### Smoothie Bike


On Thursday 17th March Year 5 pupils were treated to a practical lesson making their own healthy smoothies. They have been learning about a balanced diet and how this benefits their health.

On Wednesday the 23rd of March, a selected group of 16 pupils (8 boys and 8 girls) went to a squash tournament at the Hallamshire Squash and Tennis club (They also do Racket-ball).

During this event, two schools-Hunter's Bar and St. Wilfrid's (unfortunately Nethergreen had to pull out due to staffing complications), competed for three trophies and our title, one of which we claimed at the last Sarem Squash Festival. With two pupils on court the remaining pupils were either resting, cheering or refereeing the games for our teammates and opponents on the courts.

Within the 3 hours, both schools played 128 games in total. The three trophies (best boy's team, best girl's team and the Winning School) were all decided by the whole schools points added together.

We ended up winning the "Overall winning school" (claiming our title back!) and also taking home best boy's team award.

## **Climbing Works Bouldering Competitions**

On Friday 21st January 2022 our Y5/6 Climbing team went to compete in a <u>Preliminary round Bouldering competition</u> hosted by the Climbing Works. We had a wide variety of climbers (including some very experienced and some with minimal climbing experience) compete, with some joining at the very last minute to step in for others who couldn't be there. There were twelve different challenges to try and each pupil was allowed three attempts to master the climb. We had 2 hours to try the qualification round with 12 climbs on the "wasps" (black and yellow holds). Points were given on how many of the climbs got topped (10 points for completing it first time) and the number of attempts. There was also a bonus hold that gave 3 points. As the number of the climb increased, the challenges got harder and included things like over-hangs and monkey bars style moves that needed to be executed. The top 6 scores from our school were added up to give HBJ an overall score which was then compared to other schools. We received a top 10 result and were invited to the Finals! (This year there were around 280 Sheffield Primary School students who attended the qualification rounds from 23 different schools).

The <u>Sheffield Finals event on Friday 25th March</u> saw us take on the top 10 schools in Sheffield. The pupils accompanied by Mr. A Fairweather were able to take on the challenge of the Mint routes and finish first overall (only winning by 2 points!). Elias & Owen finished second and third in the boys individual competition. This result allowed us to qualify for the <u>Greater Sheffield Finals on Wednesday 30th March</u>. In this final round we faced schools from around the Derbyshire area. This competition saw us climbing the wasps, blacks and mints. After 12 climbs we finished in 1st place. It turned out to be an even more successful day in the individual awards with ER finishing in 3rd place, ER finishing 2nd and CB finishing in 1st place for the girls. The individual boys award mirrored the girls with OW finishing in 3rd place, SA finishing in 2nd and EI finishing in first place, allowing HBI to complete a clean sweep in the County Finals!

A team of players who haven't previously had the opportunity to represent HBJ were selected in this mixed tournament. 3 wins from 3 saw us progress into the cup but after a quarter final win we were knocked out on penalties in the semi-finals. A fantastic day of football with great support from the parents (and grandparents).

<u>Y5 Boys League</u>-Tues 29th March-20 pupils from HBJ went to take part in the Y5 Boys' Football League (with 4 Year 4 players playing up). A great night of football which saw the boys (many of whom do not play organised football outside of school) all gaining a lot of experience.
